Biography for Dr. Pascal

Dr. Pascal Scoles is Professor, Behavioral Health/Human Services, Coordinator of the Recovery & Transformation Studies, Department Psychology, Education and Human Services, and Director, Office of Collegiate Recovery at Community College of Philadelphia. From 1999 to 2011 he was the Coordinator of the Behavioral Health/Human Services program. He is a Licensed Clinical Social Worker. He received his doctorate in Addictions and Health from the University of Pennsylvania, School of Policy and Practice, his M.S.W. from Rutgers University and his bachelor's degree from LaSalle College, Philadelphia, PA.

For more than forty years he has been an educator, therapist, teacher and consultant to treatment facilities, city and state governments, the criminal justice system, as well as a psychotherapist to chemically dependent individuals and their families.

From 1979 to 1985, Dr. Pascal Scoles served as Chair and Vice Chair of the Mayor's Drug and Alcohol Executive Commission, City of Philadelphia, he continues to serve on the Commission being reappointed by five different Mayors. From 1974 to 1986 he was Principal Investigator and Senior Consultant to the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation, Alcohol-Highway Safety Program. The statewide Court Reporting Network (CRN) Evaluation system as well as the statewide DUI safe driving school curriculum was developed and implemented by Dr. Scoles under contract with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, Department of Transportation. In 2007 he was appointed to the Addictions Advisory Board, City of Philadelphia, Department of Behavioral Health and Intellectual disability services (DBHIDS). In 2014 he was appointed to the Advisory Board, City of Philadelphia, Department of Behavioral Health and Intellectual Disability Service's Faith and Spiritual Affairs. Currently (2016) he is the Project Director of the Behavioral Health Workforce Education and Training Grant (BHWET), funded by SAMHSA at Community College of Philadelphia.
